The gift from Christ Church comes at exactly the right moment to support the expanding work of the Local Transformation Units as the leaders take responsibility. Their impact on their communities is strong and varies from spiritual empowerment in Village Discipleship Schools, medical outreach to those in need and linking them to the Dreamland Hospital; developing bee-keeping, farming of goat and chickens and arable crops – even the Dreamland School has managed to grow enough maize and beans to provide a daily meal for the pupils for two terms, while the Kamusinga Demonstration farm has been able to sell bananas and kale.

Two groups have been involved in building houses for widows and disabled people, who themselves have been engaged in knitting clothes. There has even been a start in work with solar panels – there is no shortage of sunlight!

As well as routine care, the Hospital has been midwife to 26 babies, run an outreach to middle aged people combining sport with health awareness, while the Chaplaincy team has counselled over 200 patients. The Smile team (operating on cleft palates) visits this month.

10 students at the College of Transformation Studies sat for the exam in Early Child Development Education, and a further 18 have enrolled for the course.

God's love is expressed in the lives and ministry of the Mission. Please pray for everyone to walk closely with God, and to be sustained by Him in the huge demands of the work.
