### **Dick and Caroline Seed at CCB Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2019, 7.45pm, Main Hall**

When we last visited CCB in June 2017, we knew that we had come to the end of the road in terms of what we were doing in Kenya. Dick's part-time initiative to train lecturers for theological colleges and university departments (TEDS) had grown to the extent that he needed to concentrate on it full-time. In order to do that, he needed a partner college and a sponsor for the programme. We asked you to pray with us about these needs.

Since then, a whirlwind of answers to prayer has seen us link up with the Overseas Council Australia (OCA), move TEDS to a host college in Cape Town and re-orientate our mission focus to training future leaders for theological education in Africa.

Come along on Wednesday evening to find out what we have been doing and what we are planning to do in the next year. We'll show you a few video clips to give you a flavour of the people we are working with. We'll also be honest with you about the challenges we face. You will have a chance to ask questions and we will ask you to pray for the next steps on the journey.

**Message from Samuel Kitalya** - Happy New Year to you all and the entire congregation. Thank you so much indeed for standing with us in the past year and even before. We are ever grateful and will never underestimate the priceless commitment.

We've started installing security cameras to monitor the situation in homes and the schools. Its been a huge challenge for our home staff and security staff to monitor children's behaviours on site. This will limit thieves walking away with base property sometimes.

Our dump truck had a major engine problem a while ago and is being restored as well. We had some children who needed their bedding replaced benefiting from the funds too. The balance will be used over time to support the administrative costs. May the Lord bless you all for the financial support that you have given us.
