**Starfish Asia, Mike and Kerstin Wakely**

After waiting nine months for a visa for Pakistan, Mike was refused in September, which was very frustrating but possibly also a blessing well disguised, as our team in Pakistan has been more than busy with other guests and many new opportunities. However, having said that, Mike now has a visa and is leaving for Karachi on Tuesday (5th February) for just under a month. These are some of the opportunities where we have significant input:

- The launch of Christian Scout groups in about 40 schools, as part of the Pakistan Scout Movement, but with a clear Christian emphasis. This is an extra-curricular activity aimed at keeping the children enthusiastic about staying in school, as a high percentage drop out after primary schooling.
- We are also launching regular organised Bible study groups for Christian teachers, following course books from the Open Theological Seminary. This begins this month in 40 schools.
- Mike has just completed writing his 50-lesson Bible Curriculum course for Class 7 in Christian schools. It is a 200-page book in Urdu. The challenge now is a book for Class 6.
- With more funding available due to the fall in the value of the Pakistani Rupee, we now need to start regular increased support for low-paid Christian teachers, as well as giving funds to improve school facilities in some of the very poorest schools helping Christians. We aim to start supporting 10 new schools in coming weeks.

Mike will be visiting schools, connecting with many friends, especially in the Christian and educational community, and hopefully reinvigorating his own enthusiasm and inspiration for the work of Starfish Asia in Pakistan.

**Dick and Caroline S:** It was good to have Dick and Caroline in Beckenham for a short while last week to speak at the Wednesday evening mid-week meeting and meet up with others over coffee. During their time in the UK they visited CMS link churches and were able to spend time with their family here. They left the UK on 31st January for Kenya to return to their home and work in Capetown, S Africa. Please continue to remember them in their work of teaching, training and development of Diocesan theological education programmes.
