IcFEM Update

The work of the Local Transformation Units is going well. Headquarters staff have been going out to meet, teach and equip the leaders. Practical responses have been particularly noticed in Kibengi, where 100 children were helped with school uniforms; Kamukuywa where bereaved families were provided with essential food and household supplies and the community was mobilized to help them: and Maeni for their work in jails and aftercare, helping house building and providing emergency supplies to those most in need. They have also helped local farmers from the “one acre fund” to plant a wide range of crops. There is a Local Leaders Conference planned for this month, and about 550 people are expected to attend – help is needed to cover costs.

Dreamland Missionary Hospital should have solar panels installed this month which will give them an electricity supply independent of the uncertain central grid, and overcome the effect of “outings” in the middle of an operation! The Community Service allows patients with chronic diseases to be treated at home. The government National Health Insurance Scheme allows free treatment (for which the hospital is paid) in return for a monthly subscription of £5. Sponsors for this scheme are always welcome as a valuable way of supporting the mission.

Plans for Dormitories at Dreamland Education Centre, making use of foundations already laid on the site, are moving ahead. The intention is to provide dormitory accommodation for up to 300 children. The Nursery school, at headquarters, now has 85 children.

Please remember Solomon and Ruth, the Directors, and Macdon, the Mission Chaplain, in your prayers.
